RV Safety:

I would like to relate an incident that happened to three couples [one of them works with Holly at the hospital] who were camping while attending the Daytona 500. One of them woke up, dizzy, nauseous, and passed out awaking her husband. He attempted to help her and became incapacitated also. The other couples were awake now and all had the similar symptoms. Rescue personnel were called. All ended up in different hospitals, and at least two of the six spent time in a Hyperbaric chamber, all spent nearly two weeks in the hospital. Some of them have recovered and some are still having various problems and most likely will not be able to return to work or the "normal life" they had before this incident. The above was Carbon Monoxide Poisoning caused by a faulty furnace.

Please, let's all be safe while driving down the road and while set-up in camp, make sure all of our equipment is working properly.

Bourbon Lemon Pie

From Gwen Breece & Tish

Makes 6 servings

- 2 tablespoons Grated lemon rind
- 2 tablespoons bourbon whiskey
- 1 tablespoon flour
- 1 tablespoon white cornmeal
- 2 cups sugar
- 4 eggs, lightly beaten
- 1/3 cup Fresh lemon juice
- 1/4 cup half and half (I use Skim Milk)
- 3 tablespoons melted butter
- 1 Pillsbury ready made pie crust

Soak grated lemon rind in bourbon for 10 minutes. Mix flour and meal with sugar. Add beaten eggs, and mix well. Add lemon juice, lemon rind and bourbon, and mix well. Add half & half or milk and butter, mix well. I use a whisk.

Pour into a 9 inch pie shell and bake at 375 degrees for 30-35 minutes or until set.

For tarts, bake at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes. These freeze very well.

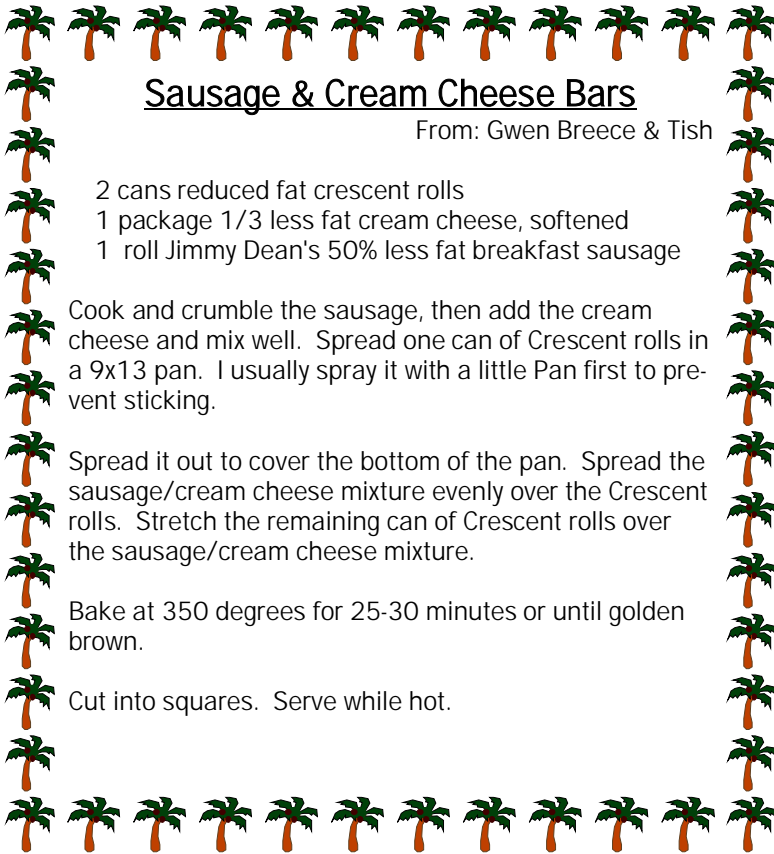

Sausage & Cream Cheese Bars

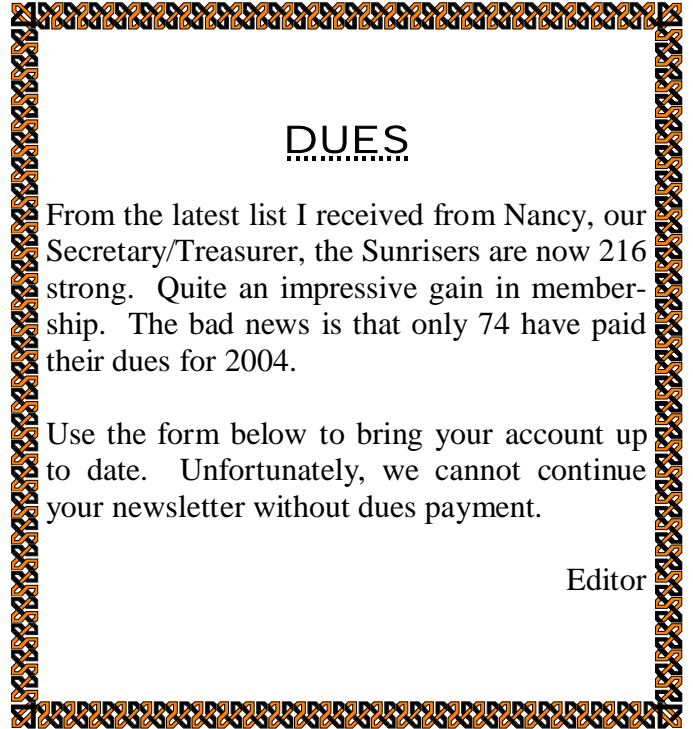
- 2 cans reduced fat crescent rolls
- 1 package 1/3 less fat cream cheese, softened
- 1 roll Jimmy Dean's 50% less fat breakfast sausage

Cook and crumble the sausage, then add the cream cheese and mix well. Spread one can of Crescent rolls in a 9x13 pan. I usually spray it with a little Pan first to prevent sticking.

Spread it out to cover the bottom of the pan. Spread the sausage/cream cheese mixture evenly over the Crescent rolls. Stretch the remaining can of Crescent rolls over the sausage/cream cheese mixture.

Bake at 350 degrees for 25-30 minutes or until golden brown.

Cut into squares. Serve while hot.
