Did we in the past six years have a rally and location that peaked your interest? If so, the Events Coordinator needs to hear from you. We try to have rallies at locations where we think the membership would like or where some of you volunteered as Wagon Masters thought there would be interest. If we did not hold a rally in an area you would like, the Events Coordinator needs to know this also - call or send him an email.

Holly and I joined the club in 2001, attending our first rally of seven attendees in January 2002. At that time, the Sunrisers were just about to fold. From January 2002 till the first Alfa National the Sunrisers hosted in April 2003, our membership was on the rise and we had great showing of thirty plus members attending National. The increase in membership was due to members spreading the word about our club and getting involved.

During that rally I was asked and accepted to be Vice President/Events Coordinator. Needless to say I was apprehensive not knowing what the job entailed. With the assistance of Kathryn Garrett and Jim Liddick, we moved forward scheduling upwards of seven rallies each year. Average attendance was 7 to 14 members, now we are averaging 30 per rally.

Our membership in 2005 was over 400 so we split the club to better serve Alfa Owners located north of Mason Dixon Line. We were able to maintain our membership of little over 200 until 2009. I understand the economy, loss of support and closure of Alfa Leisure helped our losing some of our membership. We now have our northern members back in our original east coast Alfa Owners Club.

We are still a viable Alfa Owners Club and we can only maintain that through your support. That support comes in the form of active membership, attending rallies, responding to polls, becoming a Wagon Master and hosting a rally. We also need your suggestions on location[s] that you would like to see a rally held. One of the most asked for agenda items at a rally is our "tech sessions". This discussion time is for both the 5th wheel and motor home owners.

*I would be remiss if I did not acknowledge all of our current and past officers, editors, advisors and web master. I thank them for their assistance and support these past years.*

We have a good group of people in this club. I hope that you will continue to support your future officers in any way they may request and attend as many rallies as you possibly can. **Let us continue the creed and grow and support your CLUB.**

1. The club was formed as an Alfa RV club and my desire is to continue to keep the major focus on the Alfa coaches and 5<sup>th</sup> wheels. We modified our by laws to allow existing members who purchase OTA's (other than Alfas) to remain full members of the club other than holding an office. I was a strong voice on the board to keep them as very important members and friends, but if we are to keep our focus on the Alfa, then our board should be comprised of present Alfa owners. I believe that the Alfa brand is one of the very important glues that holds us together and gives us a purpose. I have heard people say that we will all be replacing our Alfas someday, so sooner or later we will no longer be an Alfa club. I have an idea-See #2.
2. The GMC motor coach was built in the 1970's and has a very strong club base that continues to maintain these classic coaches. Another name that may not be as well known or recognized is FMC (Food Machinery Corporation), a company that built high end motor homes from 1973-76 and was the coach of choice for people such as Charles Karalt (a news correspondent who owned 6 FMC's), Clint Eastwood, Pat Boone, and Carol Burnett. There is a strong movement of owners of the FMC's who are enjoying driving, restoring, and preserving these coaches. As I talk with many of our Alfa owners, I hear the same comments, you love your Alfa and though some of you have admitted to shopping around for a replacement you just cannot find anything that suits your RV life style like the Alfa. With that in mind, as well as my desire to keep my Alfa for a long time, if elected, this is the direction that I will try to guide our club as far as our mission statement. Many of us are reaching an age where we do not want to invest in another RV so keeping our Alfa coach or 5<sup>th</sup> wheel in great shape is important to us. **Alfa Pride** could easily become our motto.
3. Communications is another area where I hope to seek some new emphasis. Dan Harvey (our webmaster), with the board's support, has worked hard to see that we have a first class web site. Problem is, not enough people are using it on a regular basis. Dan has recently implemented a chat room for any member to use. The possibilities here are endless. If some of you want to set up a chat room some evening to discuss a technical issue or a quilting discussion, photography, or whatever subject you choose, the chat room offers a perfect opportunity for you. You can contact Dan and he will help you set it up the first time. I also plan to have our 9:00 PM Wednesday night scheduled chat room occupied with at least one of your board members so you can offer suggestions, ask questions or just say hello. Frank saw the opportunity for a web site, made it happen, now we need to better use the opportunity that Dan has provided.
4. Some members have stated that since our membership is not growing, that must mean we are on the downhill slide. I do not think we should worry too much about that. Quality vs quantity. We already have a great membership base. If we continue to have good rallies and fulfill a need for our members, we will continue to be a great club. If we can provide good technical support at our rallies and on our web site, we may actually have an increase in membership as other Alfa owners see the value and want to become a part of an important organization.
5. Technical sessions have become an important part of our rallies. As the events chairman for the past 3 years, I have tried to make sure we have a few hours scheduled at each rally for this discussion. I think the club should have at least one show and tell as part of our tech sessions, either technical or upgrades to the interior or exterior of a 5<sup>th</sup> wheel or coach. Many of you have made some GREAT improvements that others would like to see.
6. Educational sessions are another area where I will expand upon if chosen as your new president. I think you will see examples of this at the Asheville rally as well as the Stone Mountain rally. I have received permission to present the "Geeks on Tour" class both on the use of **Picasa** (photography management system available "free" from Google) and also a presentation on the use of **Microsoft's "Streets and Trips"**. I have 60 day free trial DVDs for all members who attend one of our fall rallies.
7. Snail Mail letters will be sent at least once a year to all members around April in case they miss information on our web site. Marty Istock (our treasurer) said we picked up 10 renewals this summer as a result of our snail mailing.
8. Rallies will continue to be held in locations that you want and where the recreational and educational opportunities are available. For 2011, we already have a great start on some fantastic rallies. This is something I think is most important for the future success of our club.

This is the summary of 8 of the most important issues that I plan to focus on if chosen to be your next president. If you have any comments (good or bad) on the plans and direction I have outlined above, please let me know at one of our upcoming rallies or send me an e mail at JCroes@aol.com. ## Hooks and Bytes

Hello Friends!

Janet and I want to thank everyone who was part of the Wedding Reception we had at the Birch Run, Michigan rally. It was complete with gifts, cards, decorations and even a cake! I have been struggling with a program that will make life easier for Frank Ayers and anyone else that wants to contribute photos to our website. I believe I have finally found the right one and it has been installed on the server. To access "Gallery" go to the Photo page and click on "Photo Gallery" to start the program.

Did you know that our website Forums program has over 4,000 registered users? Most of them did sign up just after Alfa closed down but a fair number are still monitoring our boards. Thanks to John Croes who stays pretty active in the Forums.

Do you know what "Message Tags" are and how they are used? Message Tags are code you can add to your Forum message to make it more powerful and draw more attention. It can also make it easier for a reader to transfer to another page using a link. When adding a message to the Forums, there is a popup menu on the left side of your editor box. It defines the code used in message tags. The first rule is that all tags are contained within brackets. [ and ] to be precise. The second rule is that you have to start and stop the tag. Let me give you an example:

The word RED as typed here would be in black text as typed. But, if it were [red]RED[/red] then the text would be red in your finished Forum message. Also know that the brackets and everything contained therein is not visible in your finished message.

Message tags can also be used on links contained within a message. For example:

"Please check out our website at <http://www.sunrisers.org>" would not be active in a Forum message. But, "Please check out our website at [url]<http://www.sunrisers.org>[/url] would be active. (Users can click on the url and the browser would take them to that url.) Again, everything in the brackets becomes invisible in the final message.

Our Chat room could use a little more attendance. We meet every Wednesday night at 9pm in the "General Chat" room. I am guilty of forgetting about the chat and it appears I am not the only one. I am going to add it to my calendar so my phone will beep at me when it is chat time. I can send out a bulk phone message to anyone that wants me to. Just send me an email to [webmaster@sunrisers.org](mailto:webmaster@sunrisers.org) and include your cell number. You will get a text message ½ hour before the chat.
