With the Alfa no longer in production one of our goals is to help you find ways to upgrade your coach or to maintain it in top condition. One of the ways we have done this recently was to ask Freightliner Custom Chassis trainer Mike Cody to present a 2 day Alfa only training class. Your response to this was great. We had 22 people (Alfa owners) sign up for the class and still had a waiting list.

For many of us, our RV's are the single most expensive purchase we have made in the past 10 years and we purchased the Alfa brand because it has so much to offer. As many of you have commented in the past, "I go to RV shows and see new coaches and some of the features are really eye catching, but in the end, they just are not the total package like the Alfa". Many of us have affectionately referred to the Alfas as beluga whales because of the shape of the front cap. I found out this week that beluga is the Russian word for white. Gee, guess that nickname is more appropriate than I realized.

This is your club and its success depends on your participation. Most of us are no longer spring chickens so you should not depend on your officers and wagon masters to carry the full load. 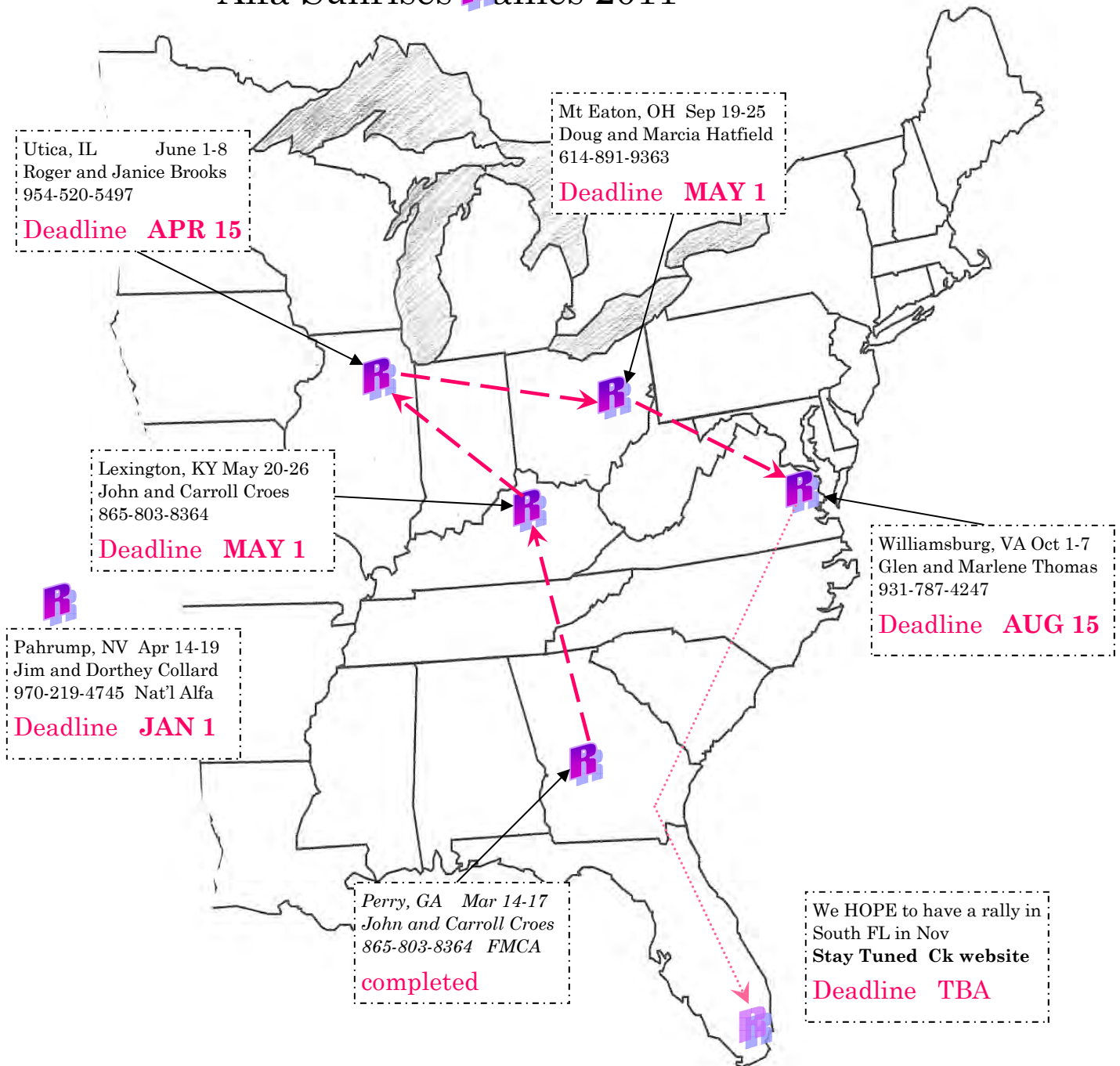
Tribute to Jim Poel

Whenever we gathered at an event where Jim and his wife, Lovada, were, the conversation usually turned to old planes. Jim retired from American Airlines after 38 years as a pilot. He and Lovada were very involved in the Glen H. Curtiss Museum in Hammondsport, New York. This past summer, Jim and many others at the museum were working on the replica of the Albany Flyer to prepare for its maiden flight and have it ready for an event to celebrate the 100th anniversary of Naval Aviation. While piloting the plane on its second flight, Jim was involved in a serious crash and spent almost 5 months in the hospital recovering. Jim returned home to Florida and was continuing his recovery and planning his future when he suffered a fatal heart attack. Jim and Gwen Breece, John Santee and Marcia Mengel spent a few hours and had lunch with Jim and Lovada earlier that day and were amazed at Jim's positive attitude and determination to return to the cockpit of his planes. Jim had the heart attack a couple of hours later. Ted and Doreen Hixon represented the club at the memorial service. We will all miss Jim's humor and aviation stories. The Sunrisers sponsored a Camp Freightliner class for Alfa owners at the Freightliner Custom Chassis facility in Gaffney, South Carolina on March 21 and 22nd. Mike Cody, our SUPER instructor was his usual energetic self and presented more information than our minds could absorb in two short days. Fortunately, we also received a 3 ring binder filled with some great pictures and information as well as a CD with even more information. Mike held his 20 students spell bound and wide awake except for a few minutes after lunch which was catered by Freightliner. Freightliner also catered a dinner on Monday night for the students and their spouses, catered by **Daddy Joes BBQ** which is one of the best BBQ restaurants in the South.

John Croes attended the Camp Freightliner class two years ago when it was open for any coach manufacturer as long as the chassis was a Freightliner Custom Chassis. "***This Alfa only class was much more informative since the class was specific to our coach***". Also, it was limited to Freightliner model years 2002-2008 since those were the only years Alfa made motor homes. This allowed Mike to focus the information he presented in a very in depth manner. Mike was the Freightliner factory representative to Alfa during the start up of the motor home line and also consulted with Alfa for several months after production was underway. Mike admitted after the class that he really did enjoy the focus on a single brand as it allowed him to prepare his material so it was most helpful to his students. John Croes was the coordinator for the class and filled openings created by cancellations by first having the potential applicant fill out a Sunrisers application. After the class was over, 25 of us enjoyed dinner at the **Clock Restaurant** in Gaffney before we said our good byes and headed home, smarter than when we arrived, just 2 short days before.

Lexington, KY Rally

May 20-26, 2011

Marty and Nanci Istock and John and Carroll Croes will serve as the co-wagon masters for a rally will be at the Lexington Kentucky Horse Park from May 20-26th. This location and date were selected in order to have a rally that would be located on the way to the Utica, Illinois rally to be held June 1-8th.

The camp ground is located on the Kentucky Horse Park property which is in the middle of Lexington horse country. Where ever you drive for miles around the park, thoroughbred horse farms are present. The park has water, 50 AMP power but does not have sewer dumps at each site. We have two dump stations close to the area where we will be together. A “honey wagon” will be going thru the park each day if you have an issue with a full tank.

Steeple chase events will be going on (May 22nd) while we are there. Attendance has a separate admission charge. The Kentucky Spring Classing Hunter/Jumper show will be going on May 18th-22nd; admission to these events are included with park admission. We will get discounted tickets to the park while we are holding our rally.

We are also planning a tour of the Thoroughbred center, a horse farm where the most recent winner of the Kentucky Derby resides as well as a tour of either the Woodford Reserve or the Buffalo Trace distillery. Several distilleries are near Lexington and are considered to be part of the “bourbon trail”. The Lexington Rally is the first of four rallies that are planned in the northern sectors of our membership. The Sunrisers Rally for June 1 – June 8, 2011 will take place in Utica, IL. The location is Hickory Hollow Campground, 757 N 3029th Road, Utica, IL 61373, 815-667-4996.

The price of the campground is as follows:

They will allow you to use Passport for the first two nights making them \$17 each. Then they will take Good Sam for the next 5 nights making them \$30.60 each. When using these options the weekly cost is \$187.00. **You must have Passport and Good Sam Cards when checking in to get the discount.**

Cancellations can be made up to 48 hours prior to arrival with a \$5.00 cancellation fee.

We have reserved 24 full 30/50-amp sites. Section J, K, M, and 4 sites in H. If anyone is interested in coming in for the Memorial Day weekend before the rally they will need to make reservations as soon as possible. We will be arriving on May 25, 2011. The campground fills up for the holiday weekend and it is necessary to make reservations early. All reservations plus one night deposit must be made prior to **April 15, 2011**

- Anyone wishing to extend their stay beyond to attend the Barber Shop Quartet event that takes place June 8 – 12, 2011 at the campground should make their reservations at the same time.
- One of the highlights of the rally will be visiting Starved Rock State Park. It was established 100 years ago and they are celebrating all year. It is a remarkably beautiful park and you will not be disappointed. More information and a link is listed below. Amish Rally, Sep 19-25, 2011 [the third week]

We will stay at Evergreen Park, Mt Eaton [Dundee] on US 250 between Ashland and New Philadelphia [exit 87 off I 77] One of the Top 10 parks in US and rated 10-10-10

Park amenities – covered pool and wonderful hot tub, great Laundromat, basketball, volleyball ‘pit’, exercise room, shuffleboard, horseshoes, restrooms/showers, game room, concession stand and a wood burning fireplace in office lobby.

Games are available for a deposit including ladder ball, corn hole and equipment for activities above.

There is a dog walk and a new coin operated dog wash.

We can accommodate RV’s up to 72 ft in pull thru’s and 87 ft in back in sites. Sites include 50 amp electric, water, sewer, free WIFI and free cable TV. All spaces have asphalt pads, a picnic table, a fire bowl and a very nice ‘front yard’ complete with rail fence and landscaping. No mats are allowed on the grass, but you will have 5-6 feet of asphalt before you get to your yard.

Our park is about 15 miles N of Berlin which is the heart of Amish country.

Deadline May 1, 2011. Please call Sarah at 330-359-2787 and tell her you are part of the Alfa Sunrisers Rally on Sep 19 and pay for the first night at our discounted rally rate of \$38.25. This rate can be used for days preceding and/or following our dates.

They accept cash and credit cards at the park.

Wagon master fee is \$25.

Williamsburg Rally, Oct 1 - 8, 2011

Glen & Marlene Thomas, Wagonmasters

Our Rally is in Virginia's Historic Triangle of Jamestown, Williamsburg, and Yorktown. We will be camping at the Williamsburg KOA Resort (Exit 234 off I-64). Each site has cable, WIFI, and sewer. Rates for us will be:

- a. \$61.95 for a Super RV Site - 50 amp backin site with few trees for open sky access.
- b. \$57.95 for 50 amp full hookup - mostly pull thru's - a tree or two at the site.
- c. \$45.95 for 30 amp full hookup site - generally pull thru.

All rates now include tax. We have blocked off 11 Super sites, 7 of the 50 full hookup and 6 of the 30 amp full hookup sites - all are in the area of the enclosed pavilion we will be using. We can add more sites if we need. **Cutoff date for reservations with the campground is August 15th and you must specify you are Alfa Sunrisers.** These rates will be honored for any days before and after the rally as long as they were booked as Sunrisers and before the deadline. It's no problem if one has to leave early even after making the reservation. The registration form to be returned to the Wagonmasters will use the same cutoff.

Colonial Williamsburg - we will use a group 2 day ticket which costs \$35.00/person (less than a single day admission) and includes entry to the Colonial Governor's Palace that is not available with a single day admission. The group ticket also provides admission to those areas unavailable to the general public. We will have free parking at the Welcome Center and free transportation on the shuttle bus to the Colonial Williamsburg Village. Minimum of 15 required.

Jamestown and Yorktown - we have two options. We can visit the National Park sites of Jamestown & Yorktown using our Golden Age or Golden Access passes (total of 4 people per pass). At Jamestown we would see archeologists at work as well as the films and exhibits available in the Visitor's Center; at Yorktown there are films and exhibits as well as a walking or driving tour of the battlefields. For the second option, we could purchase group tickets to see re-created Jamestown Settlement and the Yorktown Victory Center. We'll decide when we get there after discussing it!

We will take a 3 hour harbor cruise on the "Miss Hampton" in the Newport News area to see the Norfolk Navy Base, Chesapeake Bay, Fort Monroe, Monitor/Merrimac battle site, Hampton River, Old Point Comfort Lighthouse and more. Rate for a minimum of 25 is \$18.50 + 10% tax each. With a minimum of 40, we can have the cruise ship to ourselves for a 2 pm sailing, otherwise there is just one sailing a day at 10 am. There are all sorts of shopping venues in Williamsburg at outlet stores, small boutiques and as well as Colonial Williamsburg itself.

There are many historic plantations in the area but we recommend the Berkeley Mansion on the James River between Williamsburg and Richmond on Route 5. It is the birthplace of Benjamin Harrison, son of the builder of Berkeley, three times Governor of Virginia, and a signer of the Declaration of Independence as well as. William Henry Harrison, Benjamin's third son, born at Berkeley, became the ninth President of the United States. His grandson Benjamin Harrison was our 23rd President.

We will have our usual morning coffee, some social hours, a wagonmaster's dinner and probably a potluck. We suggest lunch at one of the several Taverns [but not as a group] during our 2 day tour of Colonial Williamsburg. The campground has free pancake breakfasts every Saturday morning and we are invited on Oct 1 and 8. A tentative agenda will be provided after the registration deadline and before the Amish Rally in Ohio in September.

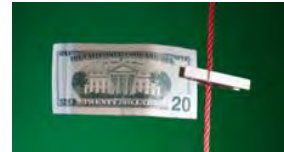

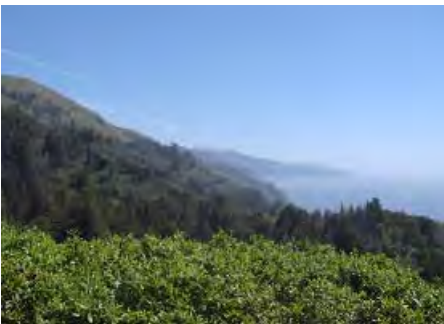

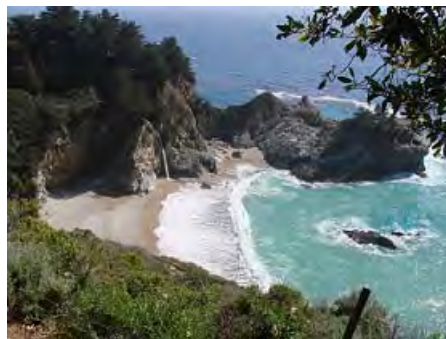
